CCC 2009 Summer Schedule
2 One-week and 2 Three-week Sessions Offered
Enrollment begins Monday, February 23, 2009

Students attending summer school at Colby Community College will have the opportunity to earn 6 credit hours in just 15* days and still have time for work and play. All on-campus classes are held in air-conditioned buildings on the CCC campus.

Mini-Session I—May 26-30
Session I—June 08-26

Mini Session II—June 01-05
Session II—June 29-July 17

Many courses are offered during summer school. Your choices are not limited to those listed in this schedule. Any course offered by the college can be taught if there is sufficient demand (at least 10 people). If you are interested in a course which is not listed, contact the Vice President of Academic Affairs office (785-460-5404).

Final Exam Dates: Mini-Session I—May 30. Mini Session II—June 05. Session I—June 26. Session II—July 17.

*Some classes will meet more than 15 days.

Admission Requirements: Admission to Colby Community College courses is open to all high school graduates and to those who have earned their GED. Also welcome to enroll in summer courses at CCC are students who usually attend other accredited colleges (**your summer school courses will transfer**), high school sophomores, juniors and seniors who have the approval of the high school principal, and adult students who do not fall into any of these categories.

Mandatory Placement: To ensure the success of students at CCC, all students are required to take developmental courses if placement test has indicated they are not fully prepared for college work. Part-time students are required to take the placement testing prior to enrolling in their first English or math classes. To meet this challenge, CCC offers developmental courses in reading and study skills, writing and mathematics. These courses are designed to give students the needed skills to succeed in their college-level classes.

Before students are allowed to enroll in mathematics, English or reading courses, they must demonstrate readiness for course work through their ACT scores and/or the COMPASS placement test.

Students who are exempt from placement testing include:

1. Students who have earned a bachelor's or an associate's degree are exempt from placement testing.
2. Students who have successfully completed ("C" or higher) and followed the developmental sequence in math, writing or reading are exempt from the requirement for assessment in that subject only.
3. Students who have successfully completed ("C" or higher) a 100-level or above course in English are exempt from the requirement for assessment in English and reading.
4. Students who have successfully completed ("C" or higher) a 100-level or above course in mathematics are exempt from the requirement for assessment in mathematics.
5. Students who have taken the ACT/SAT test within two years prior to enrollment and have scores within the acceptable range are exempt from placement testing in that subject area only.
6. Students must follow the sequence of developmental courses and pass with at least a "C" to move to the next level.

Students may retake COMPASS at a cost of \$5 per section for the following reasons:

1. Students think placement results do not accurately reflect their abilities.
2. Students think they have improved their skills through refresher work or previous developmental course work.
3. Students think the grade received does not reflect their abilities and/or they desire to advance in the course sequence.

Enrollment and Registration: Current students enroll with their advisors. The Admissions Office is open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to assist you in enrolling in summer classes. Enrollment for all summer courses will begin Monday, February 23, 2009, through the first day of class for each session. (Early enrollment is advised.) Some classes may be cancelled if early enrollment is low+. Registration dates for workshops and short courses will vary. You will register and pay fees on or before the first class at the Student Accounts Office or through the mail.

Financial Aid: Some students qualify for Federal Financial Aid to attend summer school. Please contact the Financial Aid Office for information. The Veteran's Administration has approved Colby Community College for education benefits under the GI Bill of Rights. Forms to establish eligibility for assistance are available from the Admissions Office.

Campus Bookstore: The Campus Bookstore summer hours are Monday through Friday from 8:30-11:30 a.m. **Textbook buyback** for the summer session will be the last day of both sessions.

Summer Housing and Meals: Living Center East and the Robert Burnett Memorial Student Union will be open from May 26 through July 17 to serve summer school students. The cafeteria is open for lunch during the eight weeks of Summer Sessions, Monday thru Friday. Meals are purchased individually.

Single Room Rate: \$15/night; \$60/week

Included in the fee are linens, wash cloths and towels. Blankets and pillows are not included.

H.F. Davis Memorial Library: The H.F. Davis Memorial Library at Colby Community College is open 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Monday-Friday during the summer sessions. Feel free to utilize the extensive collection of electronic resources as well as traditional print and audiovisual materials. Internet access and word processing are also available.

Recreation: You'll find places to relax and take a break from classes both on campus and in the community. The recreation center in the Student Union is open as are the college tennis courts, college swimming pool and gymnasium. The City of Colby offers municipal tennis courts, parks, and a swimming pool. Also available to students are the bowling lanes and the movie theatre. Colby has a public golf course. The City Recreation Commission offers a wide variety of summer programs in which students may participate. Colby's churches welcome CCC students.




