Colby Community College is a member of the National Junior College Athletic Association. Colby participates at the associations Division I level in the sports of baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, softball, men's and women's track (indoor and outdoor), volleyball, and wrestling. Colby Community College is one of 21 members that make up the Kansas Jayhawk Community College conference in all their sports that are recognized by the NJCAA. Additionally Colby Community College sponsors an equestrian team that competes as a member of the Intercollegiate Horse Shows Association and a coed rodeo team that competes as a member of National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association.

## Full-Time Undergraduate Students

Date compiled in the IPEDS report for the 2018-19 school year shows that Colby Community College had 182 male full-time undergraduate students and 428 female full-time undergraduate students for a total of 610 full time under-graduate students. The percentage of male students was 30% and the percentage of female students was 70%.

## Average Coaching Salaries

Colby Community College has nine head coaches for its 11 sports. The average salary for men's head coaches was \$32,712, women's head coaches was \$27,031 and coed head coaches were \$3,667. The average annual salary per Full-Time Equivalent for head coaches was \$37,385 for men's sports, \$36,041 for women's sports, and \$14,668 for coed sports. Of the nine head coaches at Colby Community College in 2018-19 seven were males and two were females.

Each of the head coaches at Colby Community College are employed on a full-time basis. Seven of the head coaches are full-time coaches. The head cross country/track and field coach serves as the head coach for both the men's and women's programs. The head coaches for the equestrian and rodeo teams are full-time instructors at the college who are part time head coaches for their respective programs.

All assistant coaches at Colby Community College were part-time employees of the college with the exception of the cross country/track and field assistant who was full time. In 2018-19 there were 11 assistant coaches of which six were male and five were female. The average salary for assistant coaches for men's teams was \$11,345, women's teams was \$11,478, and coed teams was \$4,741. The average annual salary per full-time equivalent was \$22,690 for men's teams, \$38,547 for women's teams, and \$18,964 for coed teams.
