## 2022 EADA Report

### Abstract

The Equity in Athletics Act (EADA) was designed to make prospective students and prospective student-athletes aware of an institution of higher education's commitment to providing equitable athletic opportunities for its male and female students. The report must be published by October 15 each year and made available upon request to students, prospective students, and the public.

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## Background Information

Colby Community College (CCC) is a member of the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA). Colby participates at the associations Division I level in the sports of baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, softball, men's and women's track (indoor and outdoor), volleyball, and wrestling. CCC is one of 21 members that make up the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference (KJCCC) in all their sports that are recognized by the NJCAA. Additionally, CCC sponsors an equestrian team that competes as a member of the Intercollegiate Horse Shows Association (IHSA). Historically CCC has sponsored a coed rodeo team that competes as a member of National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association (NIRA), however during the 2021-22 school year there was not a rodeo team and as such they are not reported in the most current EADA report.

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## Full-Time Undergraduate Students

Date compiled in the IPEDS report for the 2021-22 school year shows that Colby Community College had 193 male full-time undergraduate students and 358 female full-time undergraduate students for a total of 556 full time under-graduate students. The percentage of male students was 35% and the percentage of female students was 65%.

## Average Coaching Salaries

Colby Community College has 9 head coaches for its 10 sports. The average salary for men's head coaches was \$33,039 and women's head coaches was \$28,004. There was not a coed head coach in 2021-22 because there was not a rodeo program. The average annual salary per Full-Time Equivalent for head coaches was \$41,299 for men's sports and \$39,535 for women's sports. Of the 9 head coaches at Colby Community College in 2021-22 seven were males and two were females.

Eight of the 9 head coaches at Colby Community College are employed on a full-time basis. Seven of the head coaches are full-time coaches. The head track and field coach serves as the head coach for both the men's and women's programs and the head cross country coach is the head coach for both men's and women's programs. The head coaches for the equestrian team is full-time instructor at the college and a part time head coach for her program.

All assistant coaches at Colby Community College were either part-time or volunteer employees of the college. In 2021-22 there were 13 assistant coaches of which seven were female and six were male. There were five volunteer assistant coaches of which three were male and two were female. The average salary for assistant coaches for men's teams was \$12,959, women's teams was \$10,367. The average annual salary per full-time equivalent was \$25,918 for men's teams, \$25,918 for women's teams.
