Administrative Offices will be closed on Thursday, July 4.

Enrollment and Registration: Current students are encouraged to meet with their assigned advisor before enrolling. The Advising Center is open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to assist students with summer enrollment. Enrollment for all summer classes will begin February 8, 2019 and continue until the first day of class. Early enrollment is advised. Classes may be cancelled due to low enrollment. Students need to register and pay fees on or before the first day of class at the Student Accounts Office, online, or through the mail.

Mandatory Placement: To assist in the success of students at Colby Community College, all students are required to take developmental courses if placement testing has indicated they are not fully prepared for college work. The full-time student is required to have ACT/SAT and/or Accuplacer scores submitted prior to enrolling. Part-time students are required to take the placement test prior to enrolling in their first English or math class. To meet this requirement, Colby Community College offers developmental courses in reading and writing, and mathematics. These courses are designed to provide students the needed skills to succeed in college-level classes. Students may retake Accuplacer at a cost of \$5 per section for the following reasons: Students feel placement results do not accurately reflect their abilities; students feel they have improved their skills through refresher work or previous developmental course work; students feel the grade received does not reflect their abilities and/or desire to advance in the course sequence.

Campus Bookstore: The Campus Bookstore summer hours are Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Textbook buyback for the summer session will be the last day of each session.

H. F. Davis Memorial Library: The H. F. Davis Memorial Library is open on Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The library is open to students and the public. Patrons may browse the collection of electronic resources as well as print and audiovisual materials. Computer access, wireless capability, printing and word processing are available to all patrons.

Comprehensive Learning Center (CLC): The CLC is located in the library and open Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Computer access and tutors are available for students who are taking summer classes. Walk-ins are welcome.
