**Admission Requirements:** Admission to Colby Community College is open to all high school graduates and to those who have earned the GED. Students who attend other accredited colleges, high school sophomores, juniors and seniors who have the approval of their high school principal are also encouraged to enroll in summer classes.

**Mandatory Placement:** Full-time students are required to have ACT/SAT and/or Accuplacer scores submitted prior to enrolling. Part-time students are required to take the placement test prior to enrolling in their first English or Math class. Students are required to take developmental courses if placement testing has indicated that they are not fully prepared for college work. To meet this requirement, Colby Community College offers developmental courses in English and Mathematics. These courses are designed to provide students the needed skills to succeed in college-level classes. Students who feel placement results do not accurately reflect their abilities; feel they have improved their skills through refresher work or previous developmental course work; or students who feel the grade received does not reflect their abilities and/or desire to advance in the course sequence may retake Accuplacer at a cost of \$5 per section.

**Enrollment and Registration:** Current students are encouraged to meet with their assigned advisor before enrolling. The Advising Center is open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to assist students with summer enrollment. Enrollment for all summer classes will begin February 10, 2020 and continue until the first day of class. Early enrollment is advised. Classes may be cancelled due to low enrollment. Students need to register and pay fees on or before the first day of class at the Student Accounts Office, online, or through the mail. Colby Community College reserves the right to cancel any class with insufficient enrollment.
