

Courses That Transfer

The Kansas Board of Regents has approved 56 courses for guaranteed transfer among all Kansas public postsecondary institutions. A student pursuing a degree or credential who completes these courses at any Kansas public community college, technical college, or university can be certain the course transfers to any other public institution in Kansas. KBOR Policy on Concurrent Enrollment Partnership (CEP)

Definition of Concurrent Enrollment

A Concurrent Enrollment Partnership student is one who is enrolled in classes at a high school where approved high school instructors teach college credit classes during the normal school day. The student is also in grades 10, 11 or 12, or a gifted student in grade 9 with an Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) recommending college experience. Payment Options

1. **Credit Card**

Contact Student Accounts at (785) 460-4665 and pay over the phone. A convenience charge will apply.

2. **Check (payable to Colby Community College)**

Wait until a statement is received and submit payment.

3. **Payment Plan**

Payment plans must be in place within two weeks of the class start date.

Failure to comply may result in being dropped from the enrolled course(s).

Tuition

Enrollment Process

1. Meet with your high school counselor or outreach coordinator to find what classes are available at CCC.
2. Submit the free application to Colby Community College located on the college website at www.colbycc.edu. Please use the High School Student application.
3. Complete or submit any required assessment/placement scores to CCC.
4. Communicate which course(s) you would like to enroll in with your counselor or coordinator.

Accelerated Outreach

Colby Community College can help students in our Concurrent Enrollment Program obtain a CCC associate degree within one year after completing high school.

The scholarship pays tuition for four consecutive sessions

(summer-fall-spring-summer).

This is a competitive scholarship.

Candidates must have a cumulative CCC GPA of 3.0 or higher and completed at least 18 hours of CCC course work prior to graduating from high school.
